MONEY MATTERS!

We get it - money is stressful! Trying to discover how you are going to pay for your education is always at the top of a student's mind. Not to worry! The University of Regina has a variety of ways that you can fund your future.

AUTOMATIC ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

These require no separate application — if you meet the criteria, you'll automatically be considered. Domestic students (permanent residents, Canadian citizens, refugees or protected persons) applying for undergraduate admission before March 15, 2027, and planning to start the fall term immediately after completing grade 12, are automatically considered for the awards below.

Students may only receive one of these scholarships, with the exception of the Hill Levene School of Business Admission Entrance Scholarship and the Education Excellence Entrance Scholarship (if applicable).

Please note that Automatic Entrance Scholarships do not apply to students in an Adult 12 Program, those who are upgrading classes, or post-secondary transfer students.

TYPES OF SCHOLARSHIPS	VALUE	CRITERIA
U of R Entrance Scholarship	\$3,000	Early conditional or final admission average of 95% or higher
U of R Entrance Scholarship	\$1,500	Early conditional or final admission average of 93 – 94.99%
U of R Entrance Scholarship	\$1,000	Early conditional or final admission average of 90 – 92.99%
U of R Out of Province Entrance Scholarship	\$1,500	Early conditional or final admission average of 85 – 94.99%
Hill Levene School of Business Administration Entrance Scholarship	\$1,000 (90-94.99%) \$2,000 (95%+)	- Early conditional or final admission average over 90%+ - Final admission average of 90%+ required to retain the scholarship
Faculty of Education Academic Excellence Entrance Scholarship	\$500 (85-89.99%) \$750 (90%+)	- Early conditional or final admission average of 85%+ - Admitted by March 15 to the Faculty of Education directly from a Canadian high school into on-campus Teacher Education Programs (Arts Education, Baccalaureat, Elementary or Secondary Education**) - Final admission average of 85%+ required to retain the scholarship

****Excluded from this scholarship are community-based and partnership programs, including NSITEP, SUNTER, and YNTER.**

COMPETITIVE & APPLICATION REQUIRED AWARDS



UR CHANCELLOR'S SCHOLARSHIP

\$40,000 (\$10,000 x 4-years) - Apply by Dec 15, 2026.

14 awards, application-based, and awarded to students who demonstrate leadership, community involvement, and academic achievement.

APPLICATION-REQUIRED SCHOLARSHIPS

Not all scholarships are automatic - many require you to apply. Once you're a newly admitted U of R student, you can use SAMS (the Student Awards Management Software) to:

- Search the awards database
- Apply for awards
- Track the status of your applications

New students entering for the first time in the fall can apply for SAMS Entrance Scholarships & Awards starting mid-January, until the March 15 deadline. The deadline to submit **application required scholarships**, and be considered for **automatic entrance scholarships**.

FUNDING FOR SPECIFIC STUDENT GROUPS

FEDERATED COLLEGE AWARDS

Students enrolled through Campion College, First Nations University of Canada, or Luther College are eligible to apply for extra awards administered by their Federated College. These can be combined with University of Regina awards. Each college lists its own application process and deadlines:

MÉTIS STUDENTS

There are specific funding sources available for Métis students. For example, the Gabriel Dumont Institute provides scholarships to Métis students who are Saskatchewan residents and registered as full-time students. Students can contact the Gabriel Dumont Institute at usponsorship@gdins.org.

BAND FUNDING

Status Indian or Inuit students may be eligible for post-secondary funding through the Post-Secondary Student Support Program. Here are the steps to apply for band funding:

1. Obtain your U of R acceptance letter.
2. Talk to your post-secondary coordinator.
3. Complete the funding application before the deadline.

Be sure to contact your post-secondary coordinator at your local band office to find out more!

GOVERNMENT STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Federal and provincial/territorial governments offer student financial assistance in two forms: loans (must be repaid) and grants (usually don't). **Apply in your home province, even if studying elsewhere.** The amount you will receive depends on your personal and family situation.
