Current Domestic High School Students**

APPLICATION PROCESS

Step One: Apply for admission at www.uregina.ca/admissions/apply.html and pay the **\$100 application fee**.

Step Two: Submit a transcript to the Registrar's Office by **March 15, 2027** to meet the Early Application Deadline.

Step Three: Check to ensure that you are registered in the courses you need for Final Admission (see reverse), and complete these courses by **June 30, 2027**.

Step Four: Submit your Final Official Transcript from your province's official online portal, after graduation, by **August 1, 2027**.

EARLY CONDITIONAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS BY FACULTY

70% AVERAGE REQUIRED FOR: Hill Levene School of Business, Engineering & Applied Science, Kinesiology & Health Studies, Nursing*, and Science**

1. One English Language Arts or Français Language Arts Course (20-1 or 30-1)
2. One Higher-Level Math Course (ex: Foundations of Math 30) or Calculus Course (20- or 30-level)
3. One Approved Math, Science, Social Science, or Language Course (20- or 30-level)
4. One Additional Approved Math, Science, Social Science, or Language Course (20- or 30-level)

70% AVERAGE REQUIRED FOR: Arts and Social Work

65% AVERAGE REQUIRED FOR: Education, La Cité universitaire francophone, Media, Art, and Performance, and School of Professional and Continuing Education

1. One English Language Arts or Français Language Arts Course (20- or 30-level)
2. One Approved Math, Science, Social Science, or Language Course (20- or 30-level)
3. One Additional Approved Math, Science, Social Science, or Language Course (20- or 30-level)
4. One Additional Approved Math, Science, Social Science, Language, Fine Art, or Other Approved Course (20- or 30-level)

- Any AP or IB course not listed, that fits into the appropriate category, may also be used.
- * Two 3-credit courses (marked +) may be used in place of one 5-credit course.

** Math courses marked ++ cannot be used as the Math course requirement (2.) for Hill Levene School Business, Engineering, Kinesiology, Nursing, or Science, but can be used as an additional course (4.).

*** Social Studies 30-2 is acceptable as a further elective if Social Studies 30-1 is not presented.

* Nursing does not allow any courses from the "Other Approved Courses" category to be used in the average calculation.

** Computer Science majors require a minimum average of 80%.

*** Any 20- or 30-level language course may be used as an approved Language course, including ELA.

FINAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS BY FACULTY

Students granted Early Conditional Admission must meet these requirements by **August 1, 2027**.

Hill Levene School of Business - 70% Applicants will be admitted as a Business Qualifying student if they are missing either the English Language Arts or Math requirement that is used for Final Admission, but still have an average of 70% on the remaining four courses. *It is strongly recommended that students have both Math 30-2 and Math 30-1, or Math 31. Applicants with an average between 60-69.99% will be admitted to the Arts Qualifying Year. + Courses should be 5-credits each. Two 3-credit courses (marked +) may be used in place of one 5-credit course requirement.

++ Social Studies 30-2 is acceptable as a further elective if Social Studies 30-1 is not presented.

The University of Regina calculates the admission average for Alberta high school students using the **higher** of the high school reported final grade or the provincial reported final grade. The student must receive credit for the course.
