AWARDS *and* FINANCIAL INFORMATION

More than 2,000 entrance awards are available at Dalhousie each year, and are awarded based on academic achievement, leadership, extracurricular involvement, community service, financial need, and cultural identity.

Additionally, Dalhousie offers automatic early entrance awards to students based on grade averages, with awards increasing depending on grades.

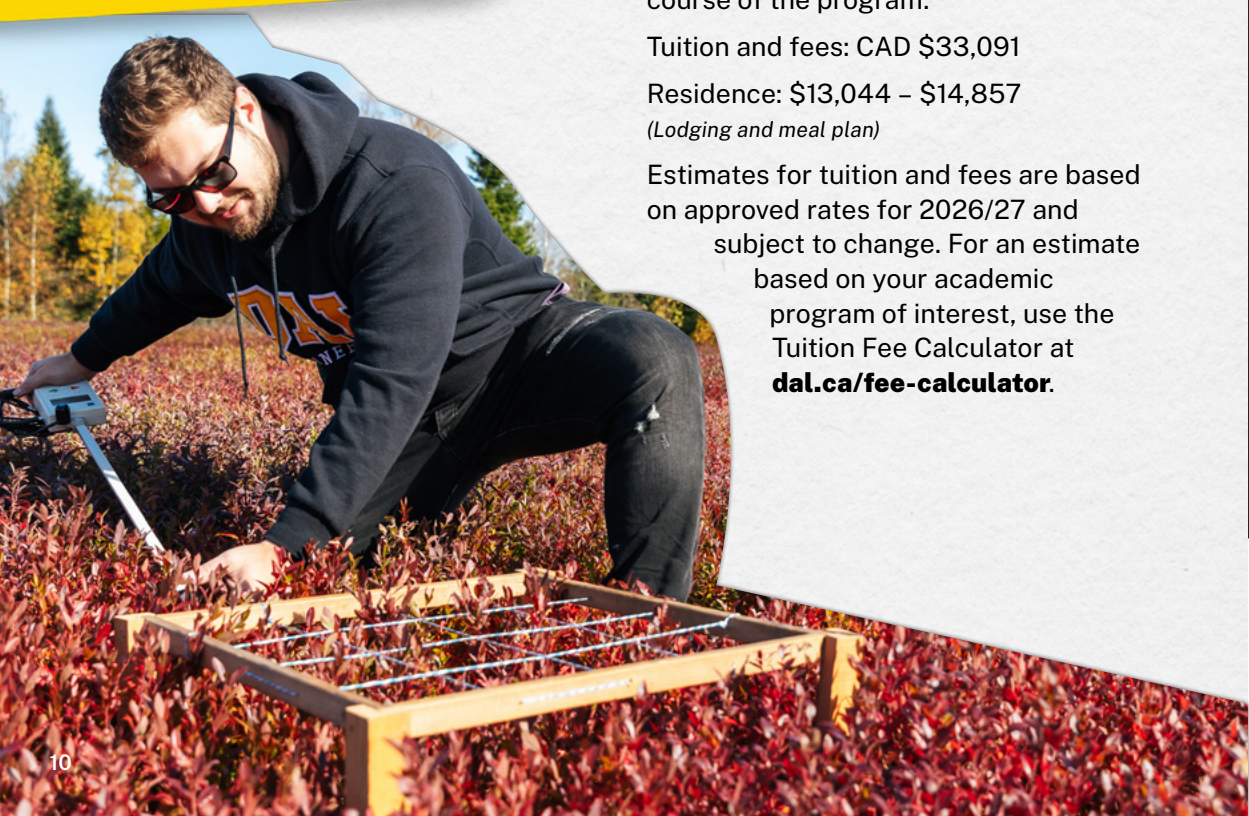
