

## Admissions Guidelines: Alberta, Northwest Territories & Nunavut

### General admission guidelines applicable to all programs:

- English 30-1
- Four additional Grade 12 (30, 30-1 or 31) courses
- Minimum overall average of 70% (75% required for Biology and Kinesiology)

### Specific program admission guidelines:

- **Applied Science (Engineering)** – Mathematics 30-1 or Mathematics 31. Physics 30 recommended. A minimum grade of 60% is required in Mathematics and Chemistry.
- **Biology** – Mathematics 30-1 or 30-2 and Chemistry 30. A minimum grade of 60% is required in Mathematics and Chemistry.
- **Business Administration** – English 30-1 with a minimum 70% and Mathematics 30-1, 30-2 or 31.
- **Chemistry** – Mathematics 30-1 or 31 and Chemistry 30. A minimum of 60% is required in Mathematics and Chemistry.
- **Community Development** - Mathematics 30-1 or Mathematics 30-2.
- **Computer Science** – Mathematics 30-1 or 31 with a minimum of 60% (applicants with only Mathematics 30-2 will be required to successfully complete Mathematics 1003 in the first semester of the program).
- **Economics** – Bachelor of Arts: Mathematics 30-1, 30-2 or 31. Bachelor of Science: Mathematics 30-1 or 31 with a minimum of 60%.
- **Environmental Geoscience** – Mathematics 30-1, 30-2 or 31 and Chemistry 30 with a minimum grade of 60%.
- **Environmental Science** – Mathematics 30-1, 30-2 or 31 and Chemistry 30 with a minimum grade of 60%.
- **Geology** – Mathematics 30-1, 30-2 or 31 and Chemistry 30 with a minimum grade of 60%.
- **Kinesiology** – Mathematics 30-1, 30-2 or 31.
- **Mathematics** – Mathematics 30-1 or 31 with a minimum grade of 70%.
- **Music** – All prospective music students will complete a School of Music application. For students interested in the Bachelor of Music and Bachelor of Music Therapy degrees, a live (or recorded) audition is required with the application.
- **Nutrition** – Mathematics 30-1, 30-2 or 31 and Chemistry 30 with a minimum grade of 60%.
- **Physics** – Mathematics 30-1 or 31. Physics 30 recommended.
- **Psychology** – Mathematics 30-1 or 30-2.

### High school transcripts:

- Current high school students can upload their most recent transcript to their admission portal, which Acadia will use to assess admission to degree programs.
- Offers of admission based on unofficial transcripts will be verified with the final official transcript from your high school or provincial Ministry of Education. You should arrange for your final transcript to be sent to Acadia at the end of June.

### Early fall admission:

Students may be considered for early fall admission before their first set of Grade 12 marks is available. Students applying for early fall admission should include their final Grade 11 marks and a school-approved list of courses they are taking in Grade 12 (both semesters) with their application. Grade 12 courses must be consistent with the guidelines listed above.

### Entrance Scholarships:

An admission application and all required supporting documents for admission must be received in the Admissions Office before March 1 in order to be considered for an entrance scholarship.
