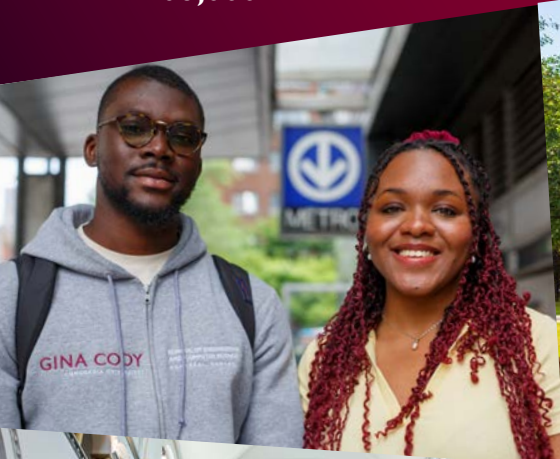
Located in the cultural hub of Montreal, Quebec, Canada, Concordia University is home to students from more than 160 countries.

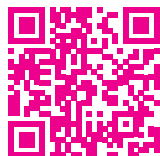

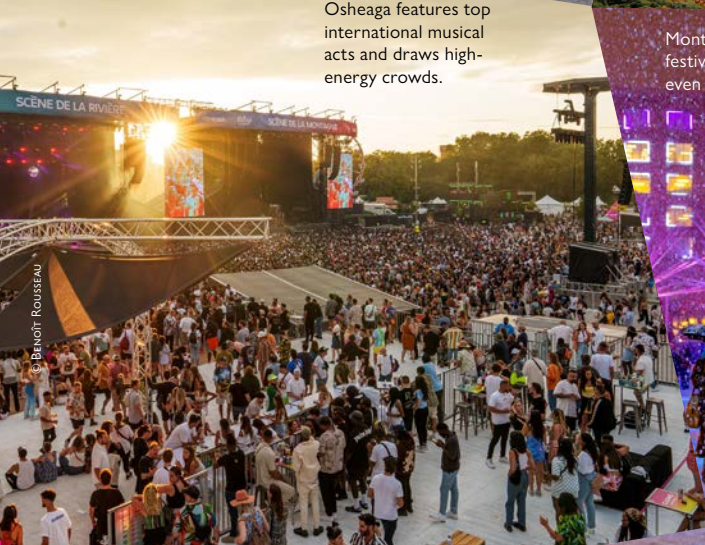

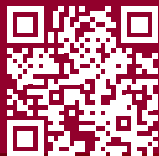
