Conditional admissions process	Students can apply as application open in October using their Final grade 11 transcripts or interim grade 12 transcripts and will be offered conditional admission if they meet all general and specific program requirements, conditional to meeting academic requirements on their final grade 12 transcripts which need to be submitted as soon as a students receives them, for our admissions team to release the final program offer.

Policy on repeated courses	Students may choose to repeat the course(s) to enhance skills and learning or to improve their grades. A student may register for a particular course twice without the permission of an instructor. A third attempt requires permission from the instructor. The grades for all attempts will be recorded; however, only the higher grade will be used in the calculation of the CGPA.
Policy on summer school, night school, online courses, and correspondence courses	Summer Term: Divided into full term or two shorter blocks (Session 1 and Session 2) lasting seven weeks. Evening/Night Classes: Offered based on departmental availability and listed actively during regular registration cycles. Online: Synchronous and Asynchronous online classes offered based on departmental availability and listed actively during regular registration cycles. Treatment of diploma marks	For Alberta 30-level courses, CapU calculates admission averages using the higher of the blended final mark (combined school mark and diploma exam) or the school mark alone. Alberta 30-level academic courses (e.g., English Language Arts
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	30-1, Math 30-1, Biology 30) are converted directly to BC Grade 12 course equivalents on a 1:1 scale.
Transcript requirements	Interim Evaluation: Alberta applicants can upload unofficial high school report cards or interim transcript PDFs directly via EducationPlannerBC (EPBC) for early/conditional admission. Official Final Transcripts: Official transcripts must be ordered through Alberta Education's myPass portal and delivered directly to the CapU Registrar's Office once final diploma exam marks are released.
Tuition differentials	Alberta students pay the standard Canadian domestic tuition rate (approx. \$152.62 per credit for non-competitive programs). CapU does not charge an out-of-province tuition differential for Alberta residents; tuition and mandatory fees are identical to those paid by BC residents.
Treatment of second choice program(s)	Alberta domestic applicants select a primary and secondary program choice on EducationPlannerBC under a single \$50 application fee. Admissions reviews the primary program choice first. If a domestic applicant is waitlisted or non-admissible for their primary program choice, the application automatically cascades to the second-choice program for assessment with no extra application fees required.
