IB credit information	Admission Requirements: We may grant a maximum of 30 credits (5 full courses) for Higher Level IB courses with grades of 5 or better, depending on program.  Transcripts: Please include High School Transcript(s) showing grades for completed/in-progress courses, future course enrolment, AND IB Predicted Grades (if applicable).
AP credit information	A maximum of 30 credits (5 full term courses) may be awarded for most courses with a result of 4 or 5.

Timing of offers/grades used	Early offers to some programs begin in December. Additional rounds of offers are made from winter onwards. Offers are conditional based on Grade 12 final marks, including prerequisites and completion of the respective Provincial Secondary School Diploma.
Deferral policy	Most programs will consider a deferral request for up to 1 year, excluding BBA, Nursing and Social Work programs. To defer, students must first accept their offer and then complete York's deferral request form by the deadline.

**Engineering** – requirements for admission BEng:

- Alberta High School Diploma
- ELA30-1 or English 30
- Chemistry 30
- Physics 30
- Pure Math 30 or Math 30-2 or Math 30-1
- Math 31
- No prerequisite below 70%

To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the low-to-mid 80s.

**Nursing** – requirements for admission 4-Year Direct Entry Nursing – BScN:

- Alberta High School Diploma
- ELA30-1 or English 30
- Senior-level math
- Biology 30
- Chemistry 30 or Physics 30
- And one additional academic course numbered 30 or 31
- No prerequisite below 70%

To gain admission to this program, your academic average should be in the mid-to-high 80s.
