### NEW INSTITUTION UPDATES/HIGHLIGHTS

**New Residence Building:**

Construction is well underway on new student housing at our Nanaimo campus. This project will add 266 new student beds, along with a common area and dining hall, greatly enhancing our students' living and learning environment. This building is expected to open in fall of 2027.

**Bachelor of Business Administration:**

Students can now complete the first two years online.

**Information Technology and Applied Systems Diploma:**

This program has now added Systems Administration and Cybersecurity as a stream.

### ENGINEERING & NURSING REQUIREMENTS

**Engineering:**

- ELA 30-1 with a minimum grade of 50%
- Physics 30-1 with a minimum grade of 65%
- Chemistry 30-1 with a minimum grade of 65%

- Math 30-1 with a minimum grade of 70%

Notes on Admission:

- Admission is based on GPA rankings.
- Students who meet or exceed the minimum admission requirements may not necessarily be admitted to the program.
- Lowest admission GPA for Fall 2024 – 2.67

**Bachelor of Science in Nursing:**

- Chemistry 20-1 and Biology 30-1 with a minimum grade of 65%
- ELA 30-1 with a minimum grade of 50%
- Math 20-1 or Math 30-2 with a minimum grade of 70%
- Completion of CASPer test.

Notes on Admission:

- Admission rankings are determined by a combination of GPA (60%) and completion of the CASPer test (40%).
- GPA for Fall 2024 intake was between 3.58-4.33, plus CASPer results.
