Minimum Alberta Admission Requirements	<p><i>Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Business Administration, Bachelor of Music, and Bachelor of Science:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students must present five academic 30-level courses to receive final admission. One of the five courses presented must be English Language Arts 30-1. • Each course presented must have a minimum grade of 60% and must be worth five credits. • In some cases, two 3-credit 30-level courses combined can be used in place of a fifth 5-credit 30-level course. English Language Proficiency Requirements	English Language Arts 30-1, with a minimum grade of 60%.
Minimum Admission Average	CMU requires a grade of at least 60% in each of the five courses presented for admission. We do not take an average of the courses presented.
Conditional Admissions Process	<p>CMU can offer high school students conditional admission based on final grades in completed 20-level and 30-level courses and proof of enrolment in additional 30-level courses.</p> <p>Each 20-level course presented must have a minimum grade of 60% and must be worth five credits. CMU does not use 3-credit 20-level courses for conditional admission.</p>
IB Credit Information	CMU recognizes select higher-level and standard-

	<p>level IB courses for transfer credit. Students must achieve a minimum grade of 4 in higher-level courses and a minimum grade of 5 in standard-level courses to receive transfer credit.</p> <p>There is no maximum number of IB courses that can be transferred. Students may elect to decline transfer credit from IB courses.</p>
AP Credit Information	<p>CMU recognizes select AP courses for transfer credit. Students must achieve a minimum grade of 4 to receive transfer credit.</p> <p>There is no maximum number of AP courses that can be transferred. Students may elect to decline transfer credit from AP courses.</p>
Policy on Repeated Courses	<p>Applicants are welcome to repeat high school courses to meet CMU's admission requirements.</p> <p>If a course is repeated, CMU will use the higher grade of the two (or more) attempts.</p>
Policy on Summer School, Night School, Online Courses, and Correspondence Courses	<p>CMU accepts summer school, night school, online courses, and correspondence courses, so long as they are academic 30-level courses worth five credits each. If applying for fall semester, final grades must be submitted by August 31.</p>

Timing of Offers/Grades Used	<p>Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Business Administration offers are released on a rolling basis, based on final grades in completed 20-level (conditional admission) and/or 30-level courses (final admission).</p> <p>Bachelor of Music and Bachelor of Science offers are initially released on April 1 and are released on a rolling basis after that, if there is still space in these</p>

	<p>programs. These offers are based on final grades in completed 20-level and/or 30-level courses. Bachelor of Music offers are also based on auditions and music theory placement tests.</p> <p>Bachelor of Education offers are released in spring. This program requires at least two years of study in a Bachelor of Music program for entry, and admission is based on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - University GPA - Interview - Audition - Testing of competencies in keyboard, guitar, percussion, and voice - Completion of required prerequisite courses <p>Bachelor of Social Work offers are released in mid-May and mid-August. This program requires at least 27 credit hours of university-level study for entry, and admission is based on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - University GPA - Interview - Essay - References - Completion of required prerequisite courses
<p>Deferral Policy</p>	<p>CMU allows domestic applicants to defer for up to two years after their original application term; for example, a domestic student who initially applied for Fall 2026 could defer until Fall 2028.</p> <p>CMU allows international applicants to defer for up to one year after their original application term; for example, an international student who initially applied for Fall 2026 could defer until Fall 2027.</p>

<p>Residence Options</p>	<p>CMU has 11 different types of student housing in three buildings: Poettcker Hall, Concord Hall, and the Katherine Friesen Apartments. Typically, first-</p>
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	year students live in Poettcker Hall or Concord Hall in traditional double-occupancy dorm rooms. Apartment style units are intended for students in their third year and beyond.

Decision Criteria	Decision criteria differ for each scholarship and award. Typically, decisions are made based on a combination of grades, essay submissions, resumes, and/or references. To learn more, visit the link above under "Scholarship information website."
Guaranteed Scholarship Program	<p>CMU provides Academic Entrance Scholarships to high school applicants with the following entrance averages:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 85% - 89.9% = \$1000 - 90% - 94.9% = \$2000 - 95% - 100% = \$3000 <p>To receive these awards, students must apply to CMU and submit a current transcript by February 28. These awards are renewable in future years, if students maintain high GPAs in university courses.</p>

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Treatment of Diploma Marks	CMU uses blended grades for admission, unless the student has challenged a diploma exam and does not have a class grade. In these cases, the diploma exam mark would be used alone as the grade for the course.
Transcript Requirements	CMU can offer conditional admission based on interim and unofficial transcripts. Final, official transcripts are required to offer final admission.

NEW INSTITUTION UPDATES/HIGHLIGHTS

CMU will be launching a condensed 16-month Bachelor of Education after-degree program in August 2026. The program features 28 weeks of student teaching practicum, strategically scheduled throughout the school year, including longer placements in rural, urban, and northern communities.

CMU's Bachelor of Social Work program is offered in a 1+3 format; students spend one year in a Bachelor of Arts program completing prerequisites (27 credit hours) and then enter the program officially in year two. The program is pre-accredited by the Canadian Association for Social Work Education (CASWE), ensuring our graduates will be fully entitled and prepared to practice social work anywhere in Canada.

CMU is one of only four universities in Canada to offer a Bachelor of Music Therapy program. This program is offered in a 2+2 format, with students completing two years in a Bachelor of Music program, followed by two years in the Bachelor of Music Therapy program. It is also offered as a 2-year after-degree. CMU's Bachelor of Music Therapy program is accredited by the Canadian Association of Music Therapists (CAMT). This means that our graduates, upon completion of the required internship and examination, can apply for the MTA Certification, which signifies they are qualified to work in the field.
