English language proficiency requirements	The minimum score required by the Department is 630 (paper-based) or 93 (Internet based) For an IBT, a minimum score of 22 in each of the 4 categories (reading skills, speaking skills, listening skills and writing skills) is required. We also accept an overall IELTS of 6.5 or higher (with no subtest score below 6.0).
Minimum admission average	70% (75% for Kinesiology, Biology, and Psychology)

IB credit information	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Acadia gives individual IB credits for IB courses completed at a higher level (grade 12) with grades of 5, 6 or 7 - Students admitted to Acadia with a score of 30 or higher on the IB diploma (they only need a 24 to be admissible) will receive 30 hours of university credit, and students who don't complete the diploma in full will have their courses considered on an individual basis

ENGINEERING & NURSING REQUIREMENTS

Engineering:

- Minimum overall average of 70%
- English 30-1
- Mathematics 30-1 or Mathematics 31 (minimum grade of 60% is required)
- Chemistry 30 is required for the certificate program (minimum grade of 60% is required)
- Two additional Grade 12 (30, 30-1 or 31) courses
- Physics 30 recommended

Nursing:

- English 30-1
- Mathematics 30-1 or 30-2
- Two of Biology 30, Chemistry 30, or Physics 30
- One additional academic grade 12 course
- No grade below 70%
