	Students wanting to take the Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts and Science degrees must have Mathematics 30-1 or 31 at a minimum of 65%. Bachelor of Music applicants must complete an audition process for entry into the program. Visit mta.ca/musicapply for full details. Minimum admission average	65%
Conditional admissions process	Normally on a case by case basis. Usually we give the benefit to the student and accept them with the condition that they complete the required course to gain full admission.
IB credit information	IB Diploma Admissions Requirements: - An overall minimum score of 26 in their 6 SL and HL courses (excluding bonus points). - A minimum score of 4 in each HL and SL course. - Predicted IB Marks accepted for admission consideration when they become available. Transfer Credits: - May receive up to 30 transfer credits for a score of 5 or higher in SL or HL and TOK with a grade of C or higher. IB Certificate Admissions Requirements: - Usually just assess these courses as their % grade along with their other HS courses. - Any IB courses can be used as consideration for admission. Transfer Credits: - HL courses with a score of 5 or higher, SL courses don't earn transfer credits for the certificate. *For transfer must receive transcript directly from IBO.

AP credit information	Admissions Requirements: - We use the % grade of these courses on the HS transcript. - If student takes AP course and its grade 12 equivalency then we take the higher of the two for the average. Transfer Credits: - A maximum of 30 credits with a score of 4 or 5 can be transferred. *Must receive transcript directly from AP College Board for transfer credit consideration. Policy on repeated courses	We will accept the higher of the two grades. We also don't look at any course that isn't the English, in the top 4 courses or the Math for Sciences so some failed courses might not even be considered.
Policy on summer school, night school, online courses, and correspondence courses	If course description falls in range of course we accept on admissions requirements then we will accept it for admission. No real deadline for these as long as we receive them before classes start. We often recommend Ontario Virtual School for students who need to upgrade their English, math or any of the accepted courses.
Treatment of out-of-province high school courses from schools such as Blyth or MEI	Same as above. Courses will be assessed for consideration comparative to courses on our accepted course list.
Application deadline	March 1, 2026 – To be considered for financial aid including entrance scholarships, major scholarships and bursaries. Also applying before this date guarantees you a spot in residence. February 10, 2026 – Bachelor of Music application February 15, 2026 – Bachelor of Fine Arts application

Timing of offers/grades used	Application opens early October. From then until about mid-January we use grade 11 final transcript for admission. From mid-January until about mid-June we would use the grade 12 mid-year transcript for grades. From mid-June onward, we use the final grade 12 transcript. *We will get back to the student in about 2 weeks maximum about the admissions decision.
Deferral policy	If student doesn't hit our admissions requirements we will defer them until the next set of grades. Students can take a gap year where they take the year after high school off to work or travel or do anything except be enrolled in another institution and in these cases, they keep their offer for the next academic year. Semesterly deferrals can be done on a case by case basis.

Decision criteria	 Entrance scholarships: From \$1,000 to \$5,000 mostly depending on average grades We have opportunities to boost these during scholarship evaluation in March with extracurriculars, work experiences etc Major scholarships: Case by case basis depending on scholarship Normally a mix of extracurriculars, school marks, work experience, volunteer experience, leadership capabilities, and any other impressive aspects that don't fit into these categories. We like to take everything into consideration. Our few top scholarships require reference letters, an essay and an interview process.
Guaranteed scholarship program	Guaranteed entrance scholarship offers if above an 80% average.

Treatment of diploma marks	Higher of the school and exam marks.
Transcript requirements	We require an official copy of the student's final high

	school transcript once it is available no matter when the student applied. They can use an unofficial copy of their transcript if applying with grade 11 or grade 12 mid-year grades. We will need a transcript at every step in the process (example: if student applies with G11 grades we need G12 mid-year grades in January and the official G12 final transcript in June).
Tuition differentials	Domestic: \$10,800 International: \$21,800 (yearly)
Treatment of second choice program(s)	Students who achieve our admissions requirements but not program requirements will get a second choice offer to a different program depending on their primary program. Music: Bachelor of Music applicants are offered to our Bachelor of Arts program until they complete the audition process or are fully offered to the Arts if they don't get accepted with the audition. Fine Arts: Same as Music but Bachelor of Fine Arts applications get offered to the Arts program until the portfolio is reviewed. Science: Most Science majors will get offered to the Arts if they haven't completed the math required to get accepted to the Sciences. If they are an Aviation applicant they will get their second choice offer to Commerce.
