	<p>QBridge: QBridge is an English language pathway to Queen's for students who are academically competitive for admission to a Queen's undergraduate degree program, but who do not meet the required admission requirements for English language proficiency. Minimum admission average	<p>Provincial High School Diploma. Five academic courses numbered 30 or 31, including English 30-1. Additional program specific prerequisites: https://www.queensu.ca/admission/applying/admission-requirements/alberta</p>
Conditional admissions process	<p>Conditional offers of admission are made to applicants who are actively studying high school courses. Conditionally admitted applicants will have until June 30 to complete their course work, and August 1 to receive their Alberta High School Diploma. Averages will be calculated using final grades in five academic courses at the 30-level including the program prerequisites. Some programs include course specific minimum grades. Final transcripts can be sent officially through MyPass.</p>

Deferral policy	Applicants with extenuating circumstances that directly impact their ability to begin their studies in the fall, and who have accepted their offer of admission by the deadline, may request a deferral of admission to that program for a period of one year. An online request, explaining the reason for the deferral request is required before August 2 nd , 2026. Scholarship application deadline	The Major Admission Awards application is due December 8th, 2025. It is recommended students apply on OUAC by mid-November to ensure they have adequate time to gain access to their SOLUS Student Centre and submit their Major Admission Award Application on time. No Application is required for Dean's International Award Program. Awarded based on academic achievement to international students enter first year of any first-entry degree program in the Faculty of Arts and Science, Stephen J.R. Smith School of Engineering and Applied Science, Smith School of Business, or the Faculty of Health Sciences.
Decision criteria	After completing the Financial Aid & Awards form, applicants will have a better understanding of what awards and financial aid they may be eligible for and its criteria.
Guaranteed scholarship program	No application required for Automatic Admission Scholarships. Awarded based on academic excellence, to students who are in the top 5% of the competitive admission average for each first-entry undergraduate degree program.

Treatment of diploma marks	School grade is used until exam results are posted and then blended grade will be used for average calculation.
Transcript requirements	Grade 11 marks will be used as placeholders until Grade 12 marks become available. It is beneficial for an applicant to include their Grade 12 enrolled/registered courses on their Detailed Academic Report. Prerequisite course(s) for a program are used to calculate the admission average for the program(s) applied to. Offers are made on a rolling basis when application(s) are complete, typically between December and the middle of May.

Treatment of second choice program(s)	Applicants can apply to up to 3 programs. Ranking of program choices or school choice rankings will not factor into admission decisions. Commitment Scholars:

The Commitment Scholars Award recognizes students who show leadership in racial justice, social justice, or diversity. Ten awards of \$48,000 over four years are available. Eligible applicants include those from underrepresented groups such as Black, Indigenous, racialized students, LGBTQ2S+, and persons with disabilities. **Deadline is February 15th, 2026.**

International Admission Awards:

Awards of up to \$100,000 over 4 years are available for first year international students entering their Queen’s Undergraduate degree program on a study permit. International students may also be eligible for Queen’s Principle’s Scholarships
