Conditional admissions process	All offers are conditional upon the successful completion of all conditions outlined in the offer of admission.
IB credit information	Minimum overall score of 26 (including bonus points) in IB diploma, including three courses at the Higher Level. AP credit information	Applicants who have completed Advanced Placement exams from the College Board are required to submit their examination results for evaluation. Policy on repeated courses	Trent University will consider the highest grade achieved on repeated courses.
Policy on summer school, night school, online courses, and correspondence courses	Trent University considers all courses as equivalent, regardless of if they were completed in summer school, night school, or online.
Treatment of out-of-province high school courses from schools such as Blyth or MEI	Trent University considers all courses as equivalent.

Timing of offers/grades used	Rolling admission format – offers will be sent as we review applications and grades. We can send conditional offers based on grade 11 and early grade 12 marks. Final, unconditional admission will be dependent on completing all admission requirements during the grade 12 year.
Deferral policy	Deferrals are permitted for up to one year from the original acceptance start term (i.e., students admitted for Fall 2026 can defer until Fall 2027). Deferral requests must be submitted through the applicant’s myTrent portal using the “Deferral Request Form.”

Treatment of diploma marks	Trent University will take the higher of the course or diploma marks.
Transcript requirements	Canadian high school applicants are encouraged to submit the "Canadian High School Student Self-Reported Grades" form under the "Academics" tab of the myTrent portal. This allows the Admissions Office to assess for an early, conditional offer of admission for select programs. If you are admitted to Trent University while your high school studies are still in progress, then your offer of admission is conditional upon you meeting the minimum admission requirements of the program you are admitted to. Admissions will require your high school to either mail or email (admissions@trentu.ca) your final, official high school transcript in July.

ENGINEERING & NURSING REQUIREMENTS

Nursing:

- English 30-1, Biology 30, Chemistry 30, and Math 30-1 or 30-2, all with a minimum final grade of 70%
 - 1 additional academic 30 or 31 course
 - Minimum overall grade of 80-85%
- *Competitive program – the minimum average may not be sufficient for admission into the program.

Chemical Engineering: Trent/Swansea Dual Degree:

- English 30-1, Chemistry 30, Physics 30, and Math 30-1 or 30-2
- 1 additional academic 30 or 31 course
- Minimum overall grade of 80-85%

Software Engineering Co-op:

- English 30-1, Math 30-1, and Math 31
- 2 additional academic 30 or 31 courses
- Minimum overall grade of 80-85%
