Minimum Alberta admission requirements	Completion of four or five grade 11 courses, plus a competitive average in four grade 12 courses, one of which is English 30-1. Other specific course requirements vary by faculty and program.

Conditional admissions process	Students must self-report sometime during February 15 and March 15 for conditional admission. They will report their required completed courses and marks and predict their marks for any in-progress required courses. No transcript is required until the end of the year through My Pass.

Policy on repeated courses	We will accept the highest grade completed
Policy on summer school, night school, online courses, and correspondence courses	<p>We will not accept summer school courses taken after graduation and before the September term. However, if a summer course is taken in the summer after grade 11, we will accept it.</p> <p>Online courses final grades due by May 31 (they must show up on their official transcript)</p>
Treatment of out-of-province high school courses from schools such as Blyth or MEI	Students must meet Alberta graduation requirements, but we will accept external approved academic courses for admission purposes if the official transcript comes from the provincial ministry and not from the external school.

Application fee	Domestic: \$86 International: \$168
Timing of offers/grades used	For non-supplemental programs students can expect to hear back approximately one week after they self-report (as early as February 20 th); for supplemental programs it can take a few weeks to a month after self-reporting (typically late March/early April).
Deferral policy	Apply for a deferral after final grades but before the deadline of August 1. With UVic's residence policy for current high school students, it's vital to defer (if they take a gap year) to still be considered direct from high school. For more information,

Number of scholarships awarded	~ \$11 million were given between entrance and in-course scholarships.
Scholarship application deadline	March 15 is the self-reporting deadline for grades-based entrance scholarships April 30, for specific criteria scholarships (applications open Feb. 15)
Decision criteria	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students' average in the four grade 12 subjects required for their program is the sole criterion for grades-based entrance scholarships. They must self-report for consideration. Minimum 90% to be considered (85% for Indigenous students and on-shore international students). • For specific criteria scholarships, students' admission average (min 90%) is considered along with the submission of an online scholarship application. Other criteria may include volunteer work, extracurricular activities and field of study.

Treatment of diploma marks	UVic now offers a 4% boost to self-reported averages for conditional admission and grades-based entrance scholarships, as well to the final blended averages at the end of the school year.
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Transcript requirements	UVic requires one official transcript sent to Undergraduate Admissions through Alberta MyPass
Tuition differentials	All Canadian citizens and Permanent Residents pay ~\$6,500 for 10 courses (note: particular Business and Engineering courses cost more). International students pay ~\$35,000+ for 10 courses (same note applies). https://www.uvic.ca/undergraduate/finances/tuition-costs/index.php
Treatment of second choice program(s)	High school applicants who do not meet the admission requirements for their first program choice but do for their secondary choice will be contacted in May and given an alternate offer. *Students may have to submit an updated interim transcript to their admissions officer

Residence

Our two new residence buildings are completed! We now have ~3,000 beds in residence, so we will be continuing to offer a guaranteed spot in residence for current high school students for the foreseeable future.

Even newer: we are now offering a returning student priority lottery, so any student who lives in residence for Year 1 can apply for the returning lottery, and their chances are quite good. This year, around 30-40% of returning students received a room offer.
