<p>Policy on repeated courses</p>	<p>Priority for registration is given to students currently enrolled in full-time programs taking the courses for the first time over students who are returning to complete unsuccessfully passed courses. Students who wish to repeat courses must obtain permission from the respective program head and complete required admission and registration procedures. Students will</p>

	<p>not receive a second credential for the same or similar program.</p> <p>Students returning to a program after an extended absence may be required to repeat passed courses if the material is considered to have changed significantly, per the Saskatchewan Polytechnic Credentials Policy.</p>
Policy on summer school, night school, online courses, and correspondence courses	Select programs have opportunities to study via our Centre for Continuing Education which may be used for course credit in their program.
Treatment of out-of-province high school courses from schools such as Blyth or MEI	Students must meet Saskatchewan equivalents for admissions purposes.
Application deadline	<p>Most programs follow a First Qualified, First Admitted application process where applications are open all year round, with qualified & conditionally qualified applicants being accepted in date order. When the programs fill to capacity, a waitlist is started that can be used to backfill seats that come available and then carry over to future intakes.</p> <p>Select programs follow a Competitive application process. Applications are then only open between Oct 1 – February 15 for the following academic year. Supporting documentation is required by March 15 (SCBSCN has a deadline to submit documents of March 15). Acceptance is offered based on the highest grade point averages scored in the specific program requirements. No waitlist is carried over to future intakes.</p>

Timing of offers/grades used	<p>Applicants will receive the status of their application within 30 business days of applying and submitting qualifying documentation.</p> <p>Those who apply into a Competitive entry program, will be assessed once the deadlines close in March. All applicants will be assessed at that time and initial decisions will be shared in late April. Seats that are offered but aren't accepted may be backfilled into May</p>

Applicants who have accepted a seat into a program, may transfer over to an alternate program of study should it come available or the student reconsiders.
