Application fee	\$120 CDN application fee for both domestic and international applicants.
Timing of offers/grades used	<p>Education, Kinesiology, and Education/Kinesiology Combined – Early admission offers made by the end of December, and regular admission by mid-April – Grade 11 marks may be used for early admission. Only Grade 12 term 1 or final Grade 12 grades will be used to calculate an admission average for regular admission.</p> <p>Arts and Science, Agriculture and Bioresources, Edwards School of Business, Engineering – Admission is offered on a rolling basis beginning in early October – can use Grade 11 and/or Grade 12 Term 1 grades to calculate an early admission average. We strongly suggest that interested students send us their Grade 11 marks as soon as possible.</p>
Deferral policy	For some programs, you can defer to a different semester within the same academic year at no charge. Students can simply not register for classes during the semester of original entry and instead only register for classes during the semester they'd like to switch to. However, other programs, such as Engineering, may not allow this. We advise students to talk to college adviser to make a plan.

Can you apply online?	<p>Yes. Students must apply online through their student portal (PAWS) after applying for admission. Students do not have to wait for an offer of admission before applying for residence.</p>

Guaranteed scholarship program	Automatically considered by applying for admission. If apply during the Gr. 12 year, the average will be calculated twice – once at the time of admission and again following graduation. Scholarship amount is based on the highest admission average . ENGINEERING & NURSING REQUIREMENTS

Engineering – Direct Entry

1. Required grade 12 classes

- Chemistry 30 – Minimum average: 70%
- Physics 30 – Minimum average: 70%
- Mathematics 30-1 (Pre-Calculus) – Minimum average: 70% **(increasing to 75% starting in 2026/2027)**

Math 31 (Calculus) is recommended but not mandatory

2. Admission Averages

Applications are considered up until the deadline. Admission is offered on an ongoing basis until all seats are filled. Applicants who do not meet the admission average but otherwise qualify for admission may be placed on a waitlist.

Minimum admission average: 75%

3. English language proficiency

If your first language is not English, you may have to prove [proficiency in English](#) before admission.

Nursing – Non-direct Entry

Process: Apply to Arts and Science for one pre-professional year. Apply to nursing during the first year of university. If successfully admitted to nursing, another three years of study is required to complete the nursing program (total 4 year for the Bachelor of Science in Nursing).

1. Required high school subjects to complete pre-professional year courses

- English A30-1
- Biology 30
- Chemistry 30 (recommended) and
- Math 30-1 (recommended) or Math 30-2

2. Admission to Arts and Science for pre-professional year: minimum admission average requirement: 70%

3. Admission to Nursing:

- **Completion of pre-professional year (60% weighting)**

A minimum average of 60% in the [pre-professional classes](#) is required to be eligible for consideration for admission. However, the actual admission average may be higher depending on the number of competitive applicants who apply each year.

- **Casper (Computer-Based Assessment for Sampling Personal Characteristics) test (40% weighting)**

4. English language proficiency

Complete at least 3 years of full-time study in an approved English-medium secondary program including Grades 10, 11 and 12, AND at least 24 CU of the prerequisite nursing courses must be from a recognized post-secondary institution where English is the official language of instruction and examination.

OR

Completion of an accepted standardized test (TOFEL iBT, IELTS, or CAEL).
